From the Pastor's Desk



What do you see when you look into the eyes of other people?

I usually see kindness and love in the eyes of people who support me and encourage me. I see warmth and generosity in people who are working beside me to accomplish common hopes and dreams; but, I get frustrated and see people very differently when things aren't running smoothly. In times of conflict, my eyes often can't see clearly at all. I see people's mistakes and point-out things that I'd usually ignore. And ancient Chinese proverb states that we can know that the sun is setting when small things begin to cast long shadows. Often, the ways we look at people are shaped from deep within us, and the ways that we treat others are as deeply shaped by our thoughts and perspectives as they are by the actions and behaviors of others.

This month, we celebrate the festival of All Saints.

We are reminded that, even though we continue to struggle with sin in our lives, we are God's holy and chosen people. We are reminded that even when we drift off course and make decisions that we regret, the love of Jesus continues to offer us gifts of

forgiveness and chances to do better. The welcome and embrace of Jesus is great. The power of God can do great things. But, we're usually not that gracious, are we? In fact, when folks hurt and disappoint us, we often believe that they'll never change and we use that perception as an excuse to withhold our forgiveness.

In his explanation of the 8th Commandment, Martin Luther writes: *"We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything [that he does] in the kindest way."*

This month, I want to encourage you to see
the "saints" all around you.

People who don't share our thoughts and perspectives don't have to become our enemies when we understand that those who disagree with us are still God's "saints." Our struggles and conflicts with others can be tamed when we look into the eyes of other people and see people that God continues to love. The Festival of All Saints reminds us that we are *fearfully and wonderfully made* (**Psalm 139:14**) by a God who brings us together because it's "*not good*" for us to be alone (**Genesis 2:18**). And, when we see that, God works in our lives to bring healing to the whole Creation.

What do you see when you look into the eyes of other people?

Perhaps, this month, we can work together to see the "saints" in each other and see each other as people who are loved by Jesus. Maybe that's a good start in turbulent times?

2019 Offering Envelopes

Council decided to use a unified giving approach for contributions in 2019. This decision was made for several reasons. Benevolence and Building are fixed expenses. If giving to these funds is not sufficient to cover the monthly expenses, the remainder will come out of Current. Basically, all of the church's expenses come out of Current. Also reconciling weekly envelopes will be much faster. For 2019, we will replace the past funds with a General Fund. The new envelopes will have space where you can enter contributions for other things like Altar Flowers, Mission Trip, Family and Food Bank.

PACK a Box – this pamphlet will instruct you how to pack a box, but the highlights are: pick a girl or boy and age range as noted on back of pamphlet, DO include toys, hygiene items, accessories such as socks, hats/gloves, sunglasses, hair bands, and a personal note from your family...NO toothpaste, NO food of any kind, NO liquids, lotions or aerosols, NO glass, NO war toys.
3. DONATE \$9.00 for international shipping. If you are also packing a shoebox, please write one check for all the boxes your family is packing and insert into envelope provided in the pamphlet and place in your box – OR -following the directions in the pamphlet, donate \$9.00 on-line and print out your label and discover the country destination of your box. This is a great opportunity to learn about another country and culture, their people and customs.

Your Support is ESSENTIAL to our Mission!

Many have already plucked money from the Mission Tree and we are at 25% funded for 2019. We have an important decision to make about what we can achieve in 2019 and it is absolutely essential to have 100% participation in estimating our financial support. We are in the midst of creating a 2019 budget and the congregation will be discussing and voting on our plan for our 2019 ministry in early December. Our estimate of giving will impact our plan and we want to make sure our decision is based on an accurate estimate.

If for any reason you will not be participating, please let myself or the church office know so we can adjust our numbers to reflect non-participation. We completely respect your decision and there are no questions asked. Please let us know so we can make a good decision for 2019.

If you haven't had a chance to pluck money off the tree here's what you need to know:

- Our Mission and how we are living up to it was sent to every household in a letter.
- In order to continue to live God's purpose for us we need ~\$300k of support in 2019.
- The Mission Tree in the Narthex has all the money we need to live our Mission in 2019.
- Please estimate your financial support for 2019 and remove the equivalent play money from the Mission Tree.
- We don't need this play money back. It is yours to keep as a reminder of your estimate.
- Our goal is to remove all the money from the tree to fully uncover our Mission for 2019.
- Your estimate is anonymous and it is only an estimate. It is not a pledge or commitment and if things change you don't need to contact anyone.
