#### From the Pastor

"Gracious Father, we pray for Your holy catholic Church. Fill it with all truth and peace. Where it is corrupt, purify it; where it is in error, direct it; where in anything it is amiss, reform it; where it is right, strengthen it; where it is in need, provide for it; where it is divided, reunite it; for the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen"

We will pray these words together on Reformation Day (October 31).

Religions (including Christianity) experience times of upheaval, change and reformation in cycles of about 500 years. Christians

debated about the identity of Jesus for more than 400 years after His death and resurrection, and the Doctrine of the Holy Trinity emerged during the Council of Nicaea in the 5<sup>th</sup> Century. The first Christian Crusade began in 1096. The Spanish Inquisition was formed in 1478 and the Protestant Reformation began when Martin Luther nailed 95 Theses to the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany in 1517. We can better understand what is happening at Christ's Lutheran Church, right now, by realizing that the 500-year-long cycle of upheaval, change and reformation would affect our lives in approximately 2020 (500 years after the Protestant Reformation). And that is, exactly, what we are seeing.

Times of upheaval, change and reformation are never easy in the life of the Church. Our lives are complicated. Many of us are feeling more stressed and on-edge than we have felt at any other time in our lives. Little things are suddenly big things. People are speaking to each other in unhelpful ways. The political climate in America has divided us into camps of "us" and "them." And I'm sure that you are tired. You want Christ's Lutheran Church to be a place where you can find peace, calm and stability if you are at all like me. You want Christ's Lutheran Church to be a community where you feel connected to others during a time when we are having two separate in-person services, and when we're broadcasting our Sunday services on both Zoom and YouTube Live. You want to be encouraged and be reminded that Jesus is walking beside you and the people you love. You want to know that God and other people, inside the Church and outside of it, deeply care about YOU.

Many people get trapped into focusing upon only the things that are wrong and upon only the things that they lack during times of upheaval, change and reformation. But, even in uncertain times, Jesus leads us into an exciting future that is filled with opportunities. We are being challenged to think, together, about ways to share the message of Jesus using technology we have

never used in the past to invite you, your friends, your neighbors and coworkers, your children, and even your grandchildren to engage, interact, and worship in-person, at home, or while on vacation. We're being challenged to talk about what both you and other people who live in our community find most valuable and life-giving about the Church, and to search for ways to build bridges toward those who want to be a part of what we're doing at Christ's Lutheran Church even though they may not attend worship services in our building. We are being challenged, together, to explore ways to help you easily move between our inperson and online worship services while continuing to feel connected to your friends. We're being challenged to create learning opportunities where you and others can grow during activities that are being hosted both in-person and online (sometimes at the same time); to find ways to share the message of God's love with little children and with people of all ages; and to see that, while our building continues to be a place where we gather together for worship, fellowship and learning, we can also remain deeply connected with each other and with people all around the world in some new and exciting ways.

We traditionally celebrate Harvest Home during the month of October.

The bountiful harvest that we gather each year reminds us of God's continuing love and blessings. Martin Luther, when describing our daily bread in his Small Catechism, tells us that our daily bread is: "everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like." And our annual celebration of Harvest Home challenges us to think about

that and to respond to God's blessings in generous and faithful ways.

And so, this month, I would like to challenge you to think about reformation in the Church and about the goodness and faithfulness of God. How can you respond to the goodness of God by sharing some of your time and financial resources as God is moving our church into a new and exciting future? How can you be a part of God's answer to our prayer on Reformation Sunday, when we ask God to bless Christ's Lutheran Church and: "where it is right, strengthen it; where it is in need, provide for it; where it is divided, reunite it"? How can you help us move through these challenging and exciting times by joining hands with our Council, with people who are working hard to rebuild and re-envision ministries, and with all of your brothers and sisters at Christ's Lutheran Church, as we move toward the bright future that Jesus is setting before us at the dawn of this new 500-year cycle in the life of the Church and of Christianity?
